Family members do not qualify as respite providers. Private sitters are no longer an option.

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GOAL OF RESPITE CARE PROGRAM:

The SC Elks Charitable Trust is committed to providing financial assistance for respite care. Respite care will provide temporary relief for a primary caregiver, enabling them to take a much-needed break from the demands of caregiving to a dementia family member. By helping full-time caregivers take needed short-term breaks, we believe that they will have renewal and relaxation. Respite care allows the caregiver to energize, get away from caregiving responsibilities, maintain a sense of self and avoid social isolation. The patient with dementia will also have companionship and assistance with activities of daily living to meet their specific needs. The SC Elks Charitable Trust Respite Care Program *is not intended to provide long term or ongoing patient care*.

THE PROGRAM:

As respite funds are available, **a one-time \$500 respite voucher** (a statement of the amount the SC Elks Charitable Trust will pay for services) is issued and may be used in three ways:

(1) <u>IN-HOME CARE</u> - The caregiver is responsible for contacting a licensed agency to arrange for services. Do not spend the voucher before it is issued. Be sure that the company is willing to invoice The SC Elks Charitable Trust directly for care. We will not pay for any dates prior to the date the voucher was issued. The caregiver must contact the in-home care agency to discuss fees before arrangements are made. Keep track of how your voucher is spent. You will be responsible for any amount over the \$500 voucher.

(2) <u>ADULT DAYCARE-</u> The caregiver is responsible for contacting an adult daycare director to arrange for services. Discuss fees with the director and keep track **of how your voucher is spent. You will be responsible for any amount over the \$500 voucher. Daycares must be licensed. The Daycare will invoice us directly.**

(3) <u>SHORT-TERM FACILITY STAY -</u> *Please read this section carefully to avoid confusion with a short-term stay!* The SC Elks Charitable Trust does not pay for permanent placement in an assisted or skilled care facility. Vouchers are for a short-term stay. If the patient is admitted to the facility for a short term stay and then it is decided to become a permanent home; the voucher will not be honored. The caregiver is responsible for contacting the facility to arrange services and inquire if a bed is available for the patient's specific needs. You will be responsible for any amount over the \$500 voucher. Be sure that the facility will invoice us directly.
